PRINCIPALS UPDATE

It has been a wonderful start to the 2023 school year! I cannot believe we are already edging close to the halfway mark of term one. Our students have settled into classrooms extremely well and teachers are implementing rigorous teaching and learning programs to support and grow your child's learning. I have visited each classroom and I must say, I'm very

impressed to see how well our teachers, support staff and students settled into the year. I know everyone is very happy to be back at school and we are looking forward to a great year of learning and friendships but as we all know, school life can be tough. You can help your child by being really positive about their school days and making sure that your child gets

plenty of sleep. Going back to school is hard work for children and they will be extremely tired until they get used to the routines of getting up early for school.

Census Day

Tuesday 28th February is census day. Census day is that day that the Department of Education collects data on student attendance to determine funding for schools. It is important for students to be at school every day and if they are unable to attend, please call the office to let us know the reason so we can update the system. On census day it is especially

important if you can ensure your child is at school and if they are unable to attend, please let us know before 9:15am as this can help our admin team with their data tracking.

2023 School Council

Our school council is made up of a total of twelve members. Eight parents, three members of staff and one Community member. Each year some of the member vacancies are up for re-election. Membership is for 2 years.

An error was made in my previous communication to families. I stated that this year we have 4 parent vacancies This is

incorrect as we have 5 vacancies. Four 2-year positions and one 12-month casual vacancy position due to a parent leaving the school at the end of 2022. The 5th vacancy is a 12mth casual vacancy that Luan Walker was filling in which will end at the end of this month. We thank Luan for all his time and hard work, thanks Luan. Members up for re-election can renominate.

At the close of nominations on Monday 13th February 2023 we had two parent nominations. Therefore, in the parent category, I declare Tracey Ridsdale and Paul McDougall elected to the Parkwood Green Primary School Council for 2023 and 2024. Congratulations Paul and Tracey, we look forward to having you on our school council.

With two positions filled we still need to fill three more positions (two 2-year positions and one 12mth position).

I have extended the call for nomination. Nomination forms are available at the office and must be returned to the office by **4pm Friday 24th February.** If the number of nominations exceed the vacancies, we will have a community election.

At the close of nominations on Monday 13th February, I received one nomination for the vacant position in the staff category. No staff election was required.

Therefore, in the staff category, I declare Elyse Edwards elected to the Parkwood Green Primary School Council for 2023 and 2024. Congratulations Elyse.

School Review-Term 3

The Department of Education (DET) conducts reviews of schools every 4 years. This rigorous process is conducted by the Victorian Registration & Qualifications Authority (VRQA) and the evaluation is completed with support from a DET appointed external reviewer as well as external challenge partners. The school review supports each school to differentiate its improvement journey by building on current strengths and assisting it to respond to challenges. It emphasises continuous improvement and affirms that every student, no matter their background or circumstance, has a right to learn in a school committed to improvement. It maintains that every school can continue to improve.

As a school we look forward to this process to set our future goals and continue to be the best school we can be.

The leadership team will undergo training to prepare for the school review.

Happy and Healthy kids

Getting a good night's sleep helps your child stay settled, healthy, happy and ready for school the next day. Children are usually tired after school and should look forward to bedtime from about 7:30pm. Your child needs about 10 to 11 hours of sleep each night to ensure learning is maximized at school.

A bedtime routine is very important for your child as it helps them wind down at the end of the day and settles them prior to going to sleep. Getting ready for bed at the same time each day is important. The predictability of going to bed at the same time each night helps children develop a positive sleep routine and feel secure. Allowing children to stay up late, even on weekends, is not recommended as it disrupts this routine. Assist your child to wind down about an hour before bedtime by turning off the television and computer games, and encouraging quiet activities. Reading to or with your child is a great activity to incorporate into their bedtime routine.

Respectful Behaviours

Our school community has demonstrated incredible solidarity and resilience throughout the last three years. Being back in our classrooms with extra health and safety measures is another big transition, however our students are managing well and their regular attendance at school is so important for their wellbeing during these uncertain times. As we navigate these changes to onsite learning, including required mask wearing for some students, it's more important than ever that adults in our school community treat each other with

respect and kindness. The Department of Education and Training has released a new policy that describes the positive behaviour expected from parents, carers, and other adults in Victorian school communities. The policy sets clear standards of behaviour to create a safe, respectful, and inclusive learning environment for students, staff and adults. This policy is in a very easy to read format; we hope all families will take a few minutes to engage with the positive behaviours described in this policy.

School Parking

We understand that time is precious, parking availability can be limited, and we all want to get to our destination as quickly as possible. But placing our children, parents, staff, and other members of the public at risk is very concerning. We have witnessed and had reports of parents breaking road rules, making illegal u-turns, illegally parking in disabled car spaces, and parking across neighbour's driveways. I urge all drivers to please be cautious, slow down, and only park in spaces you are permitted to park in. The local police have informed me that again this year they will make regular patrols in marked and unmarked cars. I thank you for your understanding in this very important safety matter.

Supported by the Wellbeing Team, the grade six students created a project brief, outlining their aims, target audience and delivery model, and then wrote the plans for each of their sessions. The leaders created posters, then visited the classrooms to introduce themselves and promote the sessions.

Here are just a few examples of our amazing students experiencing and representing their science at Parkwood Green.




Foundation

Administration Reminders

Camps, Sports & Excursions Funding What is CSEF?

CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student (Primary school student rate: \$125 per year). The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be

allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/ or excursion costs for your child.

Are you eligible?

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student

attending a registered Government or nongovernment Victorian primary or secondary school

must: on the first day of Term one, or on the first day of Term two

- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent, and;
- b) submit an application to the school by the due date

Ready to apply?

If you are eligible for this funding and wish to apply in 2023, please fill in the attached CSEF application form and return it to the front office with a copy of your health care card.

If you received CSEF in 2022 you will not need to fill out a new application form nless you have a new student starting at the school this year who was not previously listed on the application.
