School Council

Assembly

The whole school assembly provides an opportunity for the whole school community to meet and share student achievements for the week. In 2023, whole school assemblies will be held at 2:45pm Friday's, fortnightly starting **February 10**th in the schools courtyard. The school captains will generally conduct the assembly.

During occasions of inclement weather, leadership will consider the assembly program and determine whether or not to cancel assembly or to conduct the assembly via Webex (due to privacy concerns, WebEx assemblies will only be broadcast to classrooms) or a pre-recorded assembly. Our assembly will include the singing of the Australian National Anthem, flying of the Australian flags and communicating school and community messages and celebrations. Assemblies may be rescheduled to different times of the week for special occasions eg: Remembrance Day ceremony. Parents and community members are always welcome to observe the school assembly.

Personal Property Brought to School and Personal Injury Insurance

The school and DET do not accept any responsibility for damage or loss of private property brought to school by students, visitors or staff. Parents are asked to carefully consider whether any valuable items are brought to school by their children. This can include mobile phones, calculators, toys, sporting equipment and cars parked on school premises. As the Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property, students and staff should be discouraged from bringing any unnecessary or particularly valuable items to school. I ask that all items brought to school including uniforms are clearly named using permanent markers.

Parkwood Green and DET do not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents and guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance/ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transport as well as any other transport costs.

Uniform

School uniform promotes a sense of identity, pride, cohesion and good order in a school. It allows students to feel equal and enhances individual student safety and group security, as well as enhancing the profile and identity of the school and its students within the wider community. The School Council Policy of Parkwood Green PS states that uniform is compulsory for the students of Parkwood Green. It is important that parents are vigilant in ensuring students' appearance reflects the expectations of the school community. We would appreciate your assistance in ensuring that a high standard of uniform is maintained. Footwear such as thongs, crocs and light open toe sandals are not permitted for safety reasons.

COMPASS - Stay connected

The Online Parent Portal allows parents to access up-to-date meaningful information about our school and your child's progress. Using COMPASS, parents will be able to use many features, including the ability to monitor their child's attendance, and enter an explanation for absence or lateness. Parents/ Carers will receive an SMS about important events that are occurring and be prompted to enter an explanation if their child is not at school. It is our goal to strengthen and streamline communication between home and school, so we can work together to best support students and their learning.

Parents who are yet to sign up, please download the App onto your phone **asap** and enter your unique code to get you connected. **We expect all parents to be on Compass.**

Administration Reminders

Camps, Sports & Excursions Funding

What is CSEF?

CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student (Primary school student rate: \$125 per year). The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

Are you eligible?

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must: on the first day of Term one, or on the first day of Term two

- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards OR be a temporary foster parent, and;
- b) submit an application to the school by the due date



Ready to apply?

If you are eligible for this funding and wish to apply in 2023, please fill in the attached CSEF application form and return it to the front office with a copy of your health care card.

If you received CSEF in 2022 you will not need to fill out a new application form unless you have a new student starting at the school this year who was not previously listed on the application.
